On behalf of the Board of Directors and myself, I'd like to extend a sincere thanks to all our volunteers, members and staff who worked so tirelessly throughout the year at our events. You help make them successful and unique.

Over the past year, we've had a few changes around the BCC. The solar array is in and will be operational shortly. We have initiated a Sponsor-a-Panel campaign to help pay for it.
